Dr. Christine Sizemore is the Chief of the Tuberculosis, Leprosy and other Mycobacterial Diseases Section within the Respiratory Diseases Branch of the Division of Microbiology and Infectious Diseases (DMID), at the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID), a component of the National Institutes of Health (NIH)/U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). In this capacity, she is responsible for the scientific direction, oversight, and management of NIAID's extramural research programs in mycobacterial diseases that includes fundamental science, product development and clinical evaluation for all types of health care interventions. In addition, Dr. Sizemore serves as NIAID's liaison with national and international tuberculosis programs to represent aspects of fundamental, translational and clinical research that are within the mission of NIAID.

Dr. Sizemore holds a Ph.D. in bacterial genetics and microbiology and a Masters Degree in Biology from the Friedrich Alexander University in Erlangen, Germany. Prior to joining NIAID in 2000, Dr. Sizemore spent 8 years in the pharmaceutical industry in anti-infective development.
